We are also going to revert back to the following times for the children to be in school:

**\*\*Key Stage 1 children can continue to be on school premises for their soft start at 8.45am with registration at 8.50am and they will be finishing school at 3.10pm.\*\***

Key Stage 2 children can continue to be on school premises for their soft start at **8.45am with registration at 8.55am** and they will also be finishing school at **3.15pm**.

There will be no class bubbles and Collective Worship will resume from September in our hall along with school lunches being served in the hall. We will continue to keep our enhanced cleaning regimes in place and keep our spaces well ventilated wherever possible.

From 16 August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

When an individual develops COVID-19 symptoms or has a positive test, pupils, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. They should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine).

Anyone showing Covid-19 symptoms in school (however mild) should go home and follow public health advice.

Finally, we have noticed that a lot of children have been bringing lunch boxes to school with a lot of unhealthy food items inside (several packets of crisps and chocolate or sweets) – please can we remind parents that we are a Healthy School and that children should be encouraged to eat healthily wherever possible and that only water should be brought into school to drink.

The past 16 months have been incredibly challenging but the collective efforts of our school family have seen us come through. Thank you for your support in our Covid measures – the success of which has been borne out by us remaining fully open throughout. Let us all hope that we are moving forward into a much more stable school year but we will have an Outbreak Management Plan in place should circumstances require it.
